
A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD




*1.1 displays revenue generated by the Ride For Mo event, direct donations, and funds raised and donated by supporting organizations.

2025 INCOME AND EXPENSES



INCOME AND EXPENSES BREAKDOWN



EXPENSES





Segment 28



Segment 28 is a Durango, Colorado based nonprofit mountain bike team dedicated to nurturing the next generation of elite American mountain bikers and outstanding individuals.

Northwoods Stewardship Center



The Northwoods Stewardship Center is a nonprofit educational, research, and conservation service organization serving the communities of northern Vermont and New Hampshire since 1989.

Kingdom East School District



The Kingdom East School District includes the Burke, Concord, Lunenburg, Lyndon, Newark, Sutton, and Miller’s Run schools. KESD is dedicated to providing educational opportunities outside of the classroom, offering a number of experiential learning opportunities that focus on getting kids outside and active.

Green Mountain Farm-to-School



Green Mountain Farm to School’s mission is to strengthen local food systems in Vermont by promoting positive economic relationships, education, and access between schools, farms, and communities. Their programs focus on teaching children and families cooking and gardening skills to increase access to nutritious foods across Vermont.

Kingdom Kids



Kingdom Kids is a Vermont-based nonprofit dedicated to enriching the lives of children by fostering opportunities to get outdoors. They currently serve the entirety of the Kingdom East School District and hope to expand their reach in the coming years.

Little Bellas



Little Bellas is a mountain bike organization whose goal is to help young women reach their full potential. Since their inception in 2007, Little Bellas has grown into one of the most impactful bike organizations for young women in America with camps in 23 states and counting.

Kingdom Trails



Kingdom Trails is a nonprofit mountain bike trail network located in East Burke, Vermont. Their mission is to provide recreation and education opportunities by managing, maintaining, and building trails to foster the health of the community, environment, and regional economy.

Old Spokes Home



Old Spokes Home is a nonprofit bike shop in Burlington Vermont whose “Everybody Bike Program” helps low-income Vermonters access sustainable, active transportation by making bikes and bike repairs affordable.

Vermont Youth Cycling



The Vermont Youth Cycling League provides mountain bike racing and skill development opportunities for over 300 young Vermonters annually. VTYC’s mission is to get kids outside and create opportunities for all youth to experience the physical, emotional, and social benefits of cycling while building a caring community.

Hilltopper MTB Club



Saint Johnsbury Academy's Hilltopper MTB Club provides students an opportunity to have fun, make new friends, and receive high quality instruction from certified mountain biking coaches. Our grant allowed the Hilltoppers to join the Northern New England High School Mountain Biking League (NNEMTB), improve coaches' training and expertise, and hire more female coaches.

Monarch Racing Mentor Program



The Monarch Mentor Program pairs thirty U19 girls with professional and experienced racers, 1:1, to race the entire off-road endurance race at the Low Gap Grasshopper in Ukiah, California. The program gives young girls the space to learn how to be confident, driven leaders of tomorrow - whether or not they pursue cycling in the future.

Kai Velo Monarch Racing Team



The Kai Velo Monarch Racing Team is a Northern California based domestic elite women's road team that provides full support to ambitious riders seeking to race professionally in the U.S. All elite riders engage with their communities and aim to pass on the knowledge, support, and opportunities they've received to the next generation of athletes.

Vermont Adaptive Sports Partners




Green Mountain Off-Road
